

Bogotá, April 23, 2019: Grupo Energía Bogotá continues with its expansion plan in Colombia and Latin America, in order to consolidate its position as one of the most important groups in the energy sector.

This was stated by the Group's president, Astrid Álvarez, in an interview with Dinero magazine, where she referred to the positive financial and operational results reported in 2018. Revenues reached \$4 billion, with a growth of 11.84% while net profits reached \$ 1.7 billion; 13.5% higher to that registered in 2017.

The Group continues to seek opportunities for growth and expansion both in Colombia and in the countries of the region where it has a presence such as Brazil, Peru and Guatemala. In the case of Colombia, where it has 18.84% of the electricity transmission market, it is interested in participating in the expansion plans of the Mining and Energy Planning Unit (UPME) and in the transportation of natural gas.

Abroad, Grupo Energía Bogotá continues to explore options in Brazil, where it currently has 1,100 kilometers of transmission lines and in other Latin American countries, such as Mexico and Chile.

This growth is leveraged by the Corporate Strategic Plan (PEC) drawn up in 2016, which has allowed, among other things, to have a solid Corporate Governance. In this regard, important progress has been made. For the first time, the Board of Directors of the Group will be chaired by an independent member. Furthermore, its Board of Directors will have four independent members and the decisions of the Board can only be adopted through qualified majorities.

It should be noted that during 2018, the Capital District, majority shareholder of Grupo Energía Bogotá, carried out a process of democratization of a percentage of the shareholding that it has in the GEB - an operation that in its first and second stages sold 10.6%, which amounted to \$ 1,96 billion pesos. At present, the Capital District holds 65.68% of the Group's shares.
